

# MISSION OF MERCY AS SALLY AND KIERAN HEAD FOR CALAIS

A Killarney photographer is planning a mission of mercy by organising a convey of vans filled with vital supplies to the refugee camp in Calais. Sally MacMonagle and Kieran Somers have formed Kerry to Calais group in an attempt to gather donations from across the county and transport them to the camp. Over 5000 men, women, children and babies are living in dire conditions and with winter approaching they are in need of warm clothing for children, women and men in all sizes. Tents, tarps, sleeping bags, therma rests and sleeping mats are also required.

Three Kerry businesses are providing and sponsoring the vans for the trip. Play at Height, Kerry Coaches and Killarney Glass have all stepped up to the mark and are also acting as drop off points for supplies. The last date for donations of clothing and tents is earmarked for October 15th and items can be dropped off at Phonesavers on College Street, Killarney, St Brigids Presentation Secondary School, Killarney, Park Place Apartments, Killarney, John B's Pub Listowel and Play at Height Dingle. # KILLARNEY RETAILS FULL PURPLE FLAG STATUS

The news that Killarney has retained its Purple Flag status was welcomed this week by the chairman of the Purple Flag Working Group, Paul O'Neill.

There was a full assessment of Killarney's night-time economy in August and the town has passed the test with flying colours.

Purple Flag is the international accreditation for town centres in the evening and at night

from 5pm to 5am. Like a Blue Flag, centres that achieve the required standards of 30 criteria can fly the flag. Speaking to the Killarney Outlook, Paul expressed his gratitude to a real team effort within the business and wider community: "There really was a fantastic buy-in from the whole town during the adjudication. I have to thank everyone that helped make it a successful examination. "The assessors received a warm Killarney welcome wherever they went. Management and staff were knowledgeable and informative. We have a few little areas to work on for future improvement but that's something to work towards," he said.

The assessors were particularly impressed with Killarney House and Gardens and remarked that it will be a major asset in offering a variety of evening services.

"It is another feather in the cap for the town and reinforces what we already know, that Killarney provides facilities, attractions and a unique atmosphere to be enjoyed by locals and visitors alike," Paul added. The Killarney Purple Flag working group is a joint initiative between the Chamber of Tourism & Commerce and Kerry County Council. Killarney is one of 18 towns in Ireland to attain a Purple Flag. The annual Purple Flag weekend takes place from 7th to 9th October and will feature a family fun day in the town centre on Saturday 8th October.

"We want to celebrate the success of retaining our Purple Flag status with everyone. It's a bit of fun for the family so we invite everyone to Main Street from 3pm to 6pm on Saturday 8th next," said Paul O'Neill.



# TEE TIME IN KENMARE RAISES OVER €10,000 FOR CANCER

"We are expecting more to get involved between now and the 7th October", Billy DF O'Sullivan of Heartbeat told the Killarney Outlook.


"It is a new dynamic idea and we hope the community will come along and make it a successful and fun day", he added.


# KWD CELEBRATING 3 DECADES OF SERVICE

# ANGLERS IN KERRY REMINDED TO STAY SAFE ON THE WATER



Inland Fisheries Ireland and Irish Water Safety outline water SAFETY ADVICE IN LIGHT OF 18 ANGLING RELATED DEATHS IN IRELAND IN LAST THREE YEARS

Anglers in Kerry are reminded of the importance of staying safe on the water as they enjoy fishing on Ireland's rivers, lakes and seas. There have been 18 angling related drownings in Ireland since 2014 according to Inland Fisheries Ireland and Irish Water Safety, who have joined forces to highlight water safety to the angling community. Drownings relating to angling are quite common in Ireland with four deaths reported this year. There were nine deaths reported related to angling in 2015 and a further five in 2014. In total, 122 people drowned in Ireland last year, equating to ten deaths every month with drownings often happening quickly, silently and in shallow water. Irish Water Safety advises anglers to follow these steps to avoid any danger on or near the water:

- 1. Wear a lifejacket when on or near the water and make sure that it has a correctly fitting crotch strap.
- 2. Supervise children at all times near water 30 children aged 14 and under drowned in the last ten years.
- 3. Check locally concerning dangerous currents and carry an alternative means of propulsion.
- 4. Train for your aquatic activity at www.safetyzone.ie.

5. Watch for changing weather. Be prepared to

seek shelter in good time.

- 6. Learn swimming and lifesaving skills, available nationwide for all ages through Irish Water Safety.
- 7. Avoid alcohol as it impairs judgment, balance and coordination, all of which are essential for boating.
- 8. In Marine Emergencies, call 112 and ask for the coastquard.

Ireland is a popular destination for angling with 74,000 kilometres of rivers and streams, 128,000 hectares of lakes and over 5,500 kilometres of coastline. 

# OMBUDSMAN SAYS KERRY'S PUBLIC SERVICES CAN LEARN FROM COMPLAINTS

Ombudsman Peter Tyndall said that providers of public services in Kerry should use complaints to improve the delivery of services. The Ombudsman was speaking at a seminar his office hosted in the Rose Hotel Tralee on Friday 23 September.

The seminar, 'Learning from the Kingdom's Complaints', was attended by over 100 public representatives and senior officials in public service providers.

Speaking after the event the Ombudsman said: "Very often a complaint can be a warning sign that something is going wrong with the delivery of a particular service. It is important that all providers of public services have complaints systems in place to ensure that they learn from complaints they receive. That is why my office has developed a 'Model Complaints System' that service providers can use."

The seminar was part of a two-day event in Tralee which saw staff from the Ombudsman's Office take complaints, and provide advice and assistance to the public. The Office also provided training to Kerry's Citizen Information Centres on the role of the Ombudsman and on how to take complaints on behalf of the Ombudsman's office.



3. Try to eat when you start feeling hungry. The problem with leaving eating until you're starving and feel like eating the proverbial horse, then you're bound to eat guickly and therefore risk eating more than needed. Feeling so hungry that you're dizzy, weak and irritable means that you've deprived your body of much-needed food for too long and the payback will include an inability to eat your food in a relaxed and enjoyable way. Instead, you'll be obliged to shovel in the food to try to alleviate the symptoms of weakness and feeling irritable won't help your cause any!

4. Always relax before you start eating. Take a few deep breaths through the nose and out through the mouth. As you do so, hold your breath briefly and exhale slowly by the mouth. Get rid of the stress before you start eating — in this way, you start to remove any risk of comfort eating, where food is used to alleviate stress and bring yourself to focus on relieving stress independently of food.

- Remind yourself of the rewards (good health, good looks, etc.).
- Look at the clock and mentally add 20 minutes. That is your goal: take at least 20 minutes to enjoy your food.
- 5. Drink a glass of water and/or eat a small bowl of light soup before your main dish. Drink water with your food. This will help your sensation of fullness.
- Be aware that not everyone advocates drinking during a meal though, as some people believe that this can dilute the nutrients from your meal. However, this theory doesn't convince other nutrition specialists, who believe water actually aids in digestion.[2] In other words, listen to your own body's reaction to consuming liquids during a meal and go with that.








## TAX Matters with



### HOW ARE SELF-EMPLOYED PEOPLE TAXED?

As a self-employed person you are responsible for paying your own tax through the Self-Assessment system. The tax year begins on 1 January and ends on 31 December. Self-Assessment applies to:

- Self-employed people (i.e. people carrying on their own business including farming, professions or vocations).
- People receiving income from sources where some or all of the tax cannot be collected under the PAYE system, for example: profits from rents, investment income, foreign income and foreign pensions, maintenance payments to separated persons, fees, profit arising on exercising various Share Options/Share Incentives.

### PAY & FILE SYSTEM

Individuals who are taxed under self-assessment system must complete the appropriate Form 11 return and make the payment by the 31 October. This due date is extended to Thursday, 10th November 2016 for individuals who file the 2015 Form 11 return and make the appropriate payment through ROS.

### SURCHARGE FOR LATE RETURNS

If your Return is late a 'late-filing' surcharge will apply. This surcharge, which, is added on to your tax due, is:

- 5% of the tax due or €12,695, whichever is the lesser, where the Return is submitted after the due date and on or before 31 December 2016.
- 10% of the tax due or €63.485, whichever is the lesser, where the Return is submitted after 31 December 2016.



## BRICK HELPS KILMOYLEY CLAIM BACK TO BACK TITLES

## **KILMOYLEY 1-18 BALLYDUFF 2-13**

Veteran Shane Brick has played an important role in many of Kilmoyley's wins in recent

Now in his 35th year, Brick, who earlier this summer sensationally returned to the Kilmoyley fold following a spell with Cork club Tracton, turned in another man of the match performance as his side claimed the title in overcoming Ballyduff.

Brick scored three great points, including a brilliant sideline cut and had a key role in Luke Fitzell's first-half goal which put his side on the road to victory.

The game provided neutrals with an exciting spectacle of fast, open hurling and for the first 22 minutes or so, it was competitive as Ballyduff more than matched their rivals. However, there was a strong inkling that Kilmoyley had the ability to up the pace and this was certainly the case as a golden period of dominance in the eight minutes before half-time where they scored an unanswered 1-5 including Luke Fitzell's goal which came at the end of a flowing move, helped them to a six-point lead at the interval 1-12 to 1-6. This golden spell of sweet hurling was the turning point as Ballyduff struggled to pull back the deficit.

Kilmoyley, managed this year by former Clare Senior star Fergie O'Loughlin, made two changes from the drawn encounter, with Maurice O'Connor and Luke Fitzell coming into the starting line-up.

Both made rich contributions as Kilmoyley successfully defended the title they won 12 months previously.

Ballyduff, with Padraig Boyle and Jack Goulding keeping them in touch on the scoreboard and boosted by Padraig Boyle's first goal in the 11th minute of the first half, enjoyed an early advantage with the scoreboard reading 1-1 to 0-3 in their favour.

Ballyduff's hopes suffered a serious blow when full-back Paud Costello retired injured early in the second half but Kilmoyley's assault was fast and furious and the Ballyduff defence were unable to cope.

Kilmoyley grew in confidence as the game wore on, and in Tom Murnane, Dougle Fitzell, Colman Savage and Sean Dowling, they had heroes in


Paudie O'Connor was a central figure at midfield while Daniel Collins, as in the

## **EMOTIONAL INTELLIGENCE**



Emotional Intelligence (EI) refers to the way in which we manage, perceive, understand and control emotions and relationships – both our

own and others. Research has shown that El is very important in our life – and for many people it is more important for success than general intelligence (IQ). Four different factors have been identified in EI and these include:

- 1. The ability to perceive emotions... in order to understand emotions, we have to first perceive them accurately. This might mean understanding non-verbal cues such as body language and/or facial expressions.
- 2. **Reasoning with emotions**... Emotions help us to prioritise what we pay attention to and what we respond to.
- 3. Understanding emotions... If someone is expressing emotion, we must interpret what it might mean - emotions can have a wide variety of meaning.
- 4. Managing emotions... Being able to manage our emotions, regulate our emotions and respond to the emotions of others effectively is the key to El.

In order to recognise an emotion 'as it happens 'for us, it is important to develop self-awareness. This involves tuning into our feelings, recognising what they are and the effect they have on us. Self-regulation is also important in helping us to better understand, empathise and negotiate with other people. The ability to recognise how other people feel is important for success. Being able to read other's signals and respond appropriately is key. The better we are at discerning the feelings behind another person's behaviour, the more skilled we become at communicating with them.

The good news is that EI can be learned and developed. Strategies to work on our El include:

- Observe: How do you react to others... Do you rush in to judge before you know all the facts? Do you stereotype people? Take a closer look at how you are interacting with people and try putting yourself in their shoes.
- Put the focus on others..... Give others a chance to shine- without worrying about getting attention for your accomplishments.
- Examine how you respond to stress... Do you get upset, blame others or get angry when in difficult situations. The ability to stay calm and in control when things go wrong is key to success.
- Take responsibility... If you make a mistake, apologise.
- · Know how your actions will affect others.

# **Know Your Rights:**

## **BENEFITS FOR CARERS**

My mother is in hospital and I will need to provide full-time care for at least 6 months when she gets out. What is available for people in my situation?

### **ANSWER**

There are several entitlements available to you. In order for you to qualify, the person you are caring for (your mother) must be deemed to be in need of full-time care and attention. This decision will be made by the Department of Social Protection, based on information provided by your mother's

If you are working at present and will be taking time off to care, you may be eligible for carer's leave of up to 2 years. You must have worked for your employer for a continuous period of 12 months to qualify for this leave.

While you are on carer's leave, you are entitled to get credited social insurance contributions to maintain your PRSI record.

You are entitled to annual leave and public holidays in respect of the first 13 weeks of carer's leave. Your employer cannot dismiss you or victimise you for exercising your right to carer's leave.

You may also be entitled to Carer's Benefit from the Department of Social Protection, if you have enough PRSI contributions to qualify.

If you do not qualify for Carer's Benefit, you may qualify for a means-tested Carer's Allowance. If you get Carer's Allowance, you are entitled to a Free Travel Pass. You may also qualify for the Household Benefits Package if you live with the person you are caring for.

There is also an annual Carer's Support Grant of €1,700, formerly known as the Respite Care Grant, which is paid to full-time carers in June each year. Even if you are not getting any other social welfare payment, you can qualify for this grant if you fulfil the conditions.

# HOW PEOPLE TREAT WORKERS SHOULD BE CONSIDERED WHEN CHOOSING A FUTURE PARTNER

Friendly people greet staff and say thank you. These are the type of people who see everyone as equal. They recognise that having a high paying job does not make you superior and does not give you the right to treat people badly. They treat all people (loved ones or not) with compassion and empathy.

They accept that every person has a story. The person serving might be the sole breadwinner, or perhaps they are working two jobs. Maybe they are paying for their studies. Whatever their situation, this type of person remains aware of the fact that all humans are equal. They remain kind. Such an interaction signals their ability to work well in a team. They are not judgmental. They like seeing people happy. They are genuinely nice people.

On the other hand have you ever been to a shop or restaurant and seen someone being rude to a server? You know that man or women in the corner who talks to the waitress in a condescending manner to staff? Now it just might be that they are having a bad day. (Of course, that does not give them the right to treat others badly.) Perhaps this is just a one-time incident but for some people this is a regular occurrence. They snap their fingers to get the waitress's or shop floor attendant's attention. To them staff are invisible. Whether this is intentional or unintentional, they perceive the person as inferior based on their job. These individuals are paying customers so they feel that the serving staff should fulfil their needs, regardless as to whether their demands are reasonable. Individuals who demonstrate such behaviour have a demanding personality. They may think they are better than other people. They may feel superior. They may be self-centred. They crave control and power. They may be status conscious and change their behaviour depending on the perceived status of the person they are interacting with; chances are they will not change and will not make good partners or parents.

## A FEW OPTICAL FACTS

The human eye is one of the most complex organs we have in our body and enables the most important sense in our nature: vision. It provides food for our memory, a sharp definition of the world around us, and astounding capabilities that are beyond unbelievable. If you're curious to know more about the human eye – read on:

- Your eyes are about 1 inch across and weigh about 0.25 ounce.
- The average blink lasts for about 1/10th of a second.
- Seeing is such a big part of everyday life that it requires about half of the brain to get involved.
- Around the world, about 39 million people are blind and roughly 6 times that many have some kind of vision impairment.
- Even if no one in the past few generations of your family had blue or green eyes, these recessive traits can still appear in later generations.
- Each of your eyes has a small blind spot in the back of the retina where the optic nerve attaches. You don't notice the hole in your vision because your eyes work together to fill in each other's blind spot.
- Out of all the muscles in your body, the muscles that control your eyes are the most active.
- 80% of vision problems worldwide are avoidable or even curable.

# THE WWF HELPS PEOPLE TO HELP THEMSELVES

Margaret Wanjiru is a farmer in Kenya. Her

hillside farm of nearly 15 acres is large compared to many of her neighbour's properties. But it is dwarfed by the industrial farms that span hundreds of acres along the shores of Lake Naivasha, situated in the valley below her farm.

Decades ago, Lake Naivasha seemed limitless, and companies were expanding quickly. Bigger farms needed more water and more employees – and the growing population needed water, too.

On the small farms above the lake, families like Margaret's cut down trees to build their homes and fuel their cooking fires. Soil eroded from the deforested hillsides into the lake's tributaries. Margaret remembers a year when her whole potato crop was washed away by heavy rain.

Faced with higher water bills and the expense of filtering or treating water, most of the big farms along the lake started improving their water efficiency as a cost-saving measure - they had the resources and expertise to

change. Small-scale farmers like Margaret had neither. The World Wide Fund for Nature (WWF) was talking to the big farm managers, government ministers, local authorities, and the community members. They could see how each one needed the others, and how each one could contribute to protecting the lake. It was just a matter of getting people together. As a recipient of "payment for environmental services" (PES) from the big flower farms, Margaret was able to completely reorient her farm. Instead of traditional furrows that run down the slope - essentially creating channels for water and soil to run downhill when it rains - Margaret's crops now grow along the contours of the hill with soil-supporting grass strips interspersed among them. As part of the PES scheme, farmers are encouraged to diversify with plants that do double duty. All the grasses and trees retain soil, nutrients and water, but they also provide fodder for livestock, fruit or firewood. Before planting those grass strips, Margaret had to go into the forest to get fodder. Now the cows are giving more milk and she is earning more. She also has fruit to eat, and doesn't have to go to the market to buy them and if there is a surplus, she will sell those at the market.

Five years later with the proceeds from selling fodder grasses from her farm, she has been able to buy a solar panel and build a special pen for her cows that allows her to manage their grazing and further reduce erosion.

## TODAY IS INTERNATIONAL TRANSLATION DAY

Launched in 1953, International Translation Day was established by the International Federation of Translators to pay tribute to the work of translators who endeavour to make the world a slightly smaller place by breaking down language barriers and allowing great literature to be enjoyed far more widely. The work of translators is seen as being of growing importance due to growing opportunities for international travel and globalisation of trade

The event is marked with a series of dedicated events, seminars and symposiums across the world. International Translation Day itself coincides with the feast day of St. Jerome, a Christian scholar and priest who was the first person to translate the Bible into Latin from the original Hebrew, making it accessible for the first time to a far wider audience. St. Jerome is the patron saint of translators.

## MAN INVENTS GLOW-IN-THE-DARK TOILET SEAT

When Dave Reynolds' family laughed at him for falling off the toilet in the dark, he created a glow-in-the-dark toilet seat and laughed all the way to the bank.

The Pennsylvania man had been trying to sit on the toilet in a new house and wound up falling into the bathtub. He wasn't seriously hurt, just a bruised body-and ego.

He called up his friend Tom Fittler and together they came up with a way to manufacture glowing seats that give off just enough light to let you safely navigate any bathroom, without lighting up the whole room.

Their company, Night Glow Seats, has since shipped the invention around the world.

#### SRI LANKA HAS BEEN **DECLARED MALARIA-FREE**

On September 13th In a remarkable public health achievement, Sri Lanka was certified by the World Health Organisation on having eliminated malaria, a life-threatening disease which long affected the island country.

"Sri Lanka's achievement is truly remarkable. In the mid-20th century it was among the most malaria-affected countries, but now it is malaria-free. This is testament to the courage and vision of its leaders, and signifies the great leaps that can be made when targeted action is taken. It also demonstrates the importance of grass-roots community engagement and a whole-of-society approach when it comes to making dramatic public health gains," WHO Regional Director, Dr Poonam Khetrapal Singh, said. After malaria cases soared in the 1970s and 80s, in the 1990s the country's antimalaria campaign adjusted its strategy to intensively target the parasite in addition to targeting the mosquito.

The change in strategy was unorthodox, but highly effective. Mobile malaria clinics in high transmission areas meant that prompt and effective treatment could reduce the parasite reservoir and the possibility of further transmission. Effective surveillance, engagement and education, meanwhile, enhanced the ability of authorities to respond, and mobilised popular support for the campaign.

The adaptation/ flexibility of strategies and support from key partners such as WHO and the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria fast-tracked success. By 2006, the country recorded less than 1 000 cases of malaria per year, and since October 2012, the indigenous cases were down to zero. For the past three-and-a-half years, no locally transmitted cases have been recorded.

To maintain elimination and ensure the parasite is not reintroduced to the country, the anti-malaria campaign is working closely with local authorities and international partners to maintain surveillance and response capacity and to screen high-risk populations entering the country.

## **BRIDE CHOOSES RESCUE PUPPIES OVER BOUOUETS** FOR WEDDING PHOTOS

Dog lover Sarah Mallouk Crain knew she wanted to include dogs in her wedding in some way. So when a litter of coonhound/boxer puppies came into the rescue she volunteers with, she knew exactly what to do. Instead of flowers, her wedding party held the adorable, adoptable puppies in all the wedding photos. Sarah, who fosters for and is on the board of Pitties. Love. Peace. in Elizabethtown, Pennsylvania, was hoping the photos would help the puppies find great homes. When she returned from her honeymoon, her wish came true- her amazing wedding photos went viral! Sarah is now using her social media spotlight to advocate for dog rescue and adoption.

## BEACHES AROUND THE **WORLD ARE DISAPPEARING**

No, the cause isn't sea-level rise, at least not this time. It's a little-known but enormous industry called sand mining, which every year sucks up billions of tons of sand from beaches, ocean floors, and rivers to make everything from concrete to microchips to toothpaste.

In the process, conservationists warn, the sand mining industry is damaging ecosystems, changing coastal water flows, and making beaches and communities less resilient to storm surges and floods as climate change accelerates.

Sand is actually the second-most-used natural resource on Earth, behind water, it's a finite resource, and it's depleting very quickly, but nobody thinks about it. The problem is worst in countries such as Indonesia, Thailand, Laos, and Cambodia, they're basically just sucking the sand up, taking entire coastlines and islands away.

Most of the extracted coastal sand is used to make concrete and glass, the staples of the construction industry. A 2014 report from the United Nations Environment Programme estimated that the construction industry consumed 25.9 billion to 29.6 billion tons of sand in 2012. The numbers are based not on reports of extraction - those reports don't exist - but on how much concrete was used around the world that year. The U.N. called extraction rates "unsustainable" and noted that the rate of sand mining far exceeds the ability of natural systems to replenish themselves.

China's construction industry has grown so large that it used more concrete between 2011 and 2013 than the United States did during the entire 20th century. A recent report from PricewaterhouseCoopers predicts that the global construction industry will grow 85% between now and 2030. China, the U.S., and India, the report found, will account for 57% of that growth with the U.N.'s World Urbanization Prospects report predicting that the cities will add 2.5 billion residents by 2050.

It's not just construction; sand is used in products ranging from glass to microchips to tires, toothpaste to fracking and in many, many ways that are unknown to most.

Some of the sand comes directly from the beach, which can damage habitats for sea turtles and birds, but much of it is dredged up off the seafloor by large ships, that destroys critical breeding habitats for fish and other marine life.

Although much of the industry is legal, sand mining has become so lucrative that illegal activities are rife. Numerous reports out of India carry news of murders and other crimes carried out by "sand mafias" during the course of illegal sand mining activities. Other countries with recent reports of illegal sand mining include Namibia, Morocco, Malaysia, and Israel and in California for example, almost half of the roughly \$45 billion in the coastal economy comes from tourism and recreation.

## AUTUMN DRIVING ADVICE

# DON'T GET CAUGHT OUT BY THE SEASONAL CHANGE IN DRIVING CONDITIONS

Autumn isn't all about blackberries and crunchy leaves – it also brings many changes for road users, from dazzlingly blinding sunlight to the first icy windscreen of the season. Be prepared – plan ahead to avoid being caught out.

Autumn is particularly bad for dazzle from low sun. Improve vision by making sure that the windscreen is clean – inside and out. Even non-smokers find a hazy film builds up on the inside surface of the windscreen over time. Scratches, abrasions and chips on the outside can intensify the sun's dazzle too.

#### **WINDSCREEN WIPERS**

Blades will last for two years at the most. New blades clear the screen more effectively and so help reduce dazzle from the sun. Now is a good time to renew worn blades.

#### WINDSCREEN WASHER FLUID

Top up and treat with a good quality, purposemade additive to reduce the chance of freezing. Don't use ordinary engine anti-freeze but do check the handbook carefully to make sure you fill the right reservoir.

#### **BATTERY**

This is one of the most common causes of breakdown at any time of year, but particularly in the winter when electrical loads are higher. If there's any sign of the battery struggling now, the likelihood is that it'll let you down at some time during the winter, particularly if it's more than five years old. It makes sense to renew the battery now to avoid the hassle and inconvenience of an unplanned failure later.



#### **BULBS**

Check all bulbs regularly (at least once a week) not forgetting brake lights and number plate lights. The handbook will show you how to change bulbs, though some headlight bulbs may require a visit to the garage. Carry some spare bulbs.

#### **TYRES**

Check all tyres for condition, pressure and tread depth. We recommend at least 3mm of tread for winter motoring, so if the treads are getting low think about buying new tyres now before the colder weather sets in.

#### **ANTIFREEZE**

Not just for winter, antifreeze is important all year round as it contains additives to prevent corrosion and improve summer cooling too. It should be checked as part of the regular service schedule.

A frozen engine is very expensive to repair so if there's any doubt now is a good time to

check the concentration. The handbook will give details of the correct antifreeze to use for your car — there are different types and mixing them could cause engine damage. If in doubt get a garage to check for you — many offer cheap or even free winter checks at this time of year.

## HOW TO REDUCE THE RISK AND POSSIBLE CONSEQUENCE OF BEING DAZZLED

- Keep your windscreen clean inside and out.
- Renew wiper blades if worn.
- Keep a pair of sunglasses in the car, but make use of the sun visor too.
- Slow down immediately if dazzled.

#### Bear in mind:

- if the sun is behind you, it's in the eyes of those approaching you.
- if the sun is in your eyes it's probably affecting those following you too.
- Use headlights to help others see you.
