
## **€2.5M COLLECTED IN CAR**PARKING FEES AT KERRY GENERAL HOSPITAL



Labour senator, Marie Moloney has urged Kerry schools to complete contracts aimed at significantly reducing their energy costs as soon as possible. Dozens of schools across the county have been included in a new initiative to cut electricity costs by between 10 to 15 percent per school.

Schools which are involved in the centralised electricity procurement competition are eligible for the savings. This initiative is being run by the Office of Government Procurement (OGP) in cooperation with the Department of Education and Skills and school management bodies.

"This is a great opportunity for schools to make a significant saving on their electricity costs," she said.

In order for schools to make the savings they need to return their completed contracts as soon as possible. So far around 1,000 schools countrywide have completed and returned their contracts.

## **LETTER TO EDITOR**

### A Chara,

As the dissolution of Town Councils is imminent it may be appropriate to inform your readers of what the new reality will be.

At present the 7 County Councillors for the Killarney electoral area meet six times per year to highlight and seek to resolve problems for the entire area. This is not a decision making body. Its replacement, The Municipal Districts, will have a certain number of reserved functions but their funding will come from Kerry County Council. They will be a constituent part of the overall County Council. Therefore there will not be a separate financial management structure operating within the new areas. The municipal district will not of itself be delivering services i.e. it will not employ its own staff or have its own specific budget.

Killarney Town Hall will no longer serve as a location to deal specifically with problems experienced by residents of the urban area. It will not for instance have a planning service. All planning matters will be dealt with centrally [Tralee].

For many years now Killarney Town Council in its annual budget made provision for the disbursement of relatively small sums of money to various groups and organisations e.g. Christmas in Killarney, Killarney Looking Good. Chamber of Tourism and Commerce

and quite a few other bodies that work diligently for the welfare and betterment of the people of the area.

The new Municipal District will not have the discretion to continue to grant aid these groups. Kerry County Council will have full and total control of the collection and spending of money and will not be able to selectively grant aid.

There will not be a separate management structure in each municipal area nor will there be a position similar to that of Town Clerk. There will be an area manager delegated by the County Council and financed solely by the

In conclusion therefore: All revenue collected in Killarney will accrue to Kerry County Council and will be used for the provision of county wide services. Revenue collected in a given location cannot be ring fenced for that

I hope that the above clarifies to some extent what will be the new reality. For better or for worse?



## **FOR BUDGET REVIEW**

Kerry TD Tom Fleming has called on the Minister for Finance to review the budget changes, in respect of tax relief credits for single parents. Deputy Fleming said the budget change discriminates against single parents. 'This means a cut of €32 p/w for the non primary carer or €1,650 per year', stated the Independent TD. Deputy Fleming called on Minister Noonan, to take into consideration the fact, thousands of non primary carers are care sharing two and three days every week and are paying maintenance.

The Kerry TD said he was very disappointed with Minister Noonan's response and that the Minister and his Department had no understanding of the very real and difficult implications of this decision.

## **FF CANDIDATES** FIGHT FOR SECOND **AMBULANCE**

The return of a second emergency ambulance for the Killarney and South Kerry area will be the central campaign theme of the 3 Fianna Fáil candidates in the Killarney local electoral area. Sitting Councillor John Joe Culloty is joined by Niall Kelleher and John O'Shea.

In a joint statement the candidates said "we will be fighting for the return of the second emergency ambulance for the Killarney and the South Kerry area, without the second emergency ambulance lives have been put at risk"

John O'Shea who was selected by the members of the Fianna Fail party at the recent convention is having his campaign launch in the Gleneagle hotel on the 21st of February. John is a postman, community activist, involved with underage sports, promotes tradition music through his role with the Gathering, trade union official and fundraiser for south Kerry MS.



## NEW PEDESTRIAN **CROSSING**

Under the Local and Urban Authority Road Funding Scheme Kerry County Council has been allocated a total of €12,744,971.

Safety improvement works [BS improvements] on regional and local roads:

In the Killarney area funding will be allocated towards works to be carried out at Aghadoe Cross Roads and McSweeney's Corner for a new Pedestrian Crossing.

Cllr John Sheahan has welcomed the funding of 40,000 euro for the provision of a Pedestrian crossing at the junction of College Street and Lewis road in Killarney. "I am delighted that this project has been given the green light. It will enhance the area and provide people with a safe and easy place to cross the road" he said, adding "whilst this project may be small in nature, it will also create employment for local construction companies involved with the project"

In addition to the monies allocated above, funding has also been provided to the urban authorities. Urban authorities have been given greater flexibility under this grant category and have full discretion in the selection of roads where work is being undertaken.



## **KILCUMMIN SEWERAGE SCHEME**

Following continued representations by Senator Marie Moloney with regard to the provision of a sewerage scheme for Kilcummin. She has stated: "It is very disappointing to note that Kerry County Council are dragging their heels on this and despite having advised

members at the Killarney Area Meeting that all requested information had been sent to the Department, the Minister now advises that it has not" said Senator Moloney.

The following update was received from Minister Phil Hogan.

The Kilcummin Sewerage Scheme was included in my Department's Water Services Investment Programme 2010 - 2013 as a scheme to advance through planning. The most recent proposal from the Council in relation to this scheme was received in my Department in June 2012. My Department examined this proposal and requested further information

from the Council.

Kerry County Council did not submit the information requested and the scheme had not progressed to the next stage prior to the transfer of responsibility for the delivery of Water Services Capital Infrastructure to Irish Water on 1 January 2014. Irish Water is currently preparing its Capital Investment Plan for 2014 - 2016 and this will provide for the transition of projects which were included in my Department's 2010 - 2013 Water Services Investment Programme.





### **POLYCYSTIC OVARY SYNDROME 1**

Polycystic ovary syndrome (PCOS), formerly known as the Stein-Leventhal syndrome, is a condition where at least two of the following occur, and often all three:

- At least 12 tiny cysts (follicles) develop in your ovaries.
- The balance of hormones that you make in the ovaries is altered. In particular, your ovaries make more than normal of the male hormone testosterone.
- You do not ovulate each month. Some women do not ovulate at all and so may not

Therefore, it is possible to have polycystic ovaries without the other typical symptoms that are part of the syndrome. It is also possible to have PCOS without multiple cysts in the ovary.

### How common is polycystic ovary syndrome?

PCOS is common-it is thought that around 1 in 10 women have PCOS - that is, they have at least 2 out of the 3 factors above.

### What causes polycystic ovary syndrome?

The exact cause is not totally clear. Several factors probably play a part. These include the following:

Insulin is a chemical (hormone) that controls your blood sugar level. Insulin acts mainly on fat and muscle cells, causing them to take in sugar (glucose) when your blood sugar level rises. Another effect of insulin is to act on the ovaries to cause them to produce the male hormone testosterone. Women with PCOS have what is called insulin resistance. This means that cells in the body are resistant to the effect of insulin. More insulin is then produced to try to keep the blood sugar normal. This raised level of insulin in the bloodstream is thought to be the main underlying reason why PCOS develops. It causes the ovaries to make too much testosterone which interferes with the normal function of the ovaries. This causes problems with ovulation - hence, period problems and reduced fertility. It is this increased testosterone level in the blood that causes excess hair growth on the body and thinning of the scalp hair. Increased insulin also contributes towards weight gain.

PCOS is not strictly inherited from parents to children, but it may run in some families.

Being overweight or obese is not the underlying cause of PCOS. However, if you are overweight or obese, excess fat can make insulin resistance worse.

### What are the symptoms and problems of polycystic ovary syndrome? Symptoms that occur if you do not ovulate:

Period problems- occur in about 7 in 10 women with PCOS. You may have irregular or light periods, or no periods at all.

Infertility - you need to ovulate to become pregnant. You may not ovulate each month, and some women with PCOS do not ovulate at all. PCOS is one of the most common causes of not being able to get pregnant (infertility).

### Symptoms that can occur if you make too much male hormone testosterone:

- Excess hair growth (hirsutism) occurs in more than half of women with PCOS. It is mainly on the face, lower tummy (abdomen), and chest. This is the only symptom in some cases.
- Acne, which may persist beyond the normal teenage years.
- Thinning of scalp hair (similar to male pattern baldness) occurs in some cases.

### Possible long-term problems of polycystic ovary syndrome

If you have PCOS, over time you have an increased risk of developing type 2 diabetes, diabetes

in pregnancy, a high cholesterol level, and possibly high blood pressure. For example, about 1 in 5-10 women with PCOS develop diabetes at some point. These problems in turn may also increase your risk of having a stroke and heart disease in later life. Other possible problems in pregnancy include more chance of having your baby prematurely and of having pre-eclampsia (high blood pressure in







Commercial Rowing Club has a long and happy relationship with the town of Killarney and in particular with the Commercial life of the town. As you glean through the history of the club since its formation in 1886 you will note that several hundreds of families have been associated with the club either as oarsmen and oarswomen or officers and indeed many happy relationship were known to have blossomed around its Clubhouse in the shadow of Ross Castle. Each week in this column we hope to publish a list of the great people who were associated with Commercials since 1886 when it was then known as The Drapers possibly due to it's association with the Drapery trade of the town.

In 1944 the club delegate to Killarney Regatta committee was the late John O'Brien who was then a clerk in Hilliards Drapery store Main Street and who was known to have made a major contribution to the club over many seasons and this tradition was carried on by his son Denis "Gunner " O'Brien who rowed in all grades for the club. With all the front runners resting in Ireland, Anthony Foley took an Irish second string to the west country to take on a youthful English Saxons side with Joe Schmidt in attendance running the rule over several squad members that were hoping to catch his eye ahead of the RBS six nations which commences this coming weekend. For people such as Fergus McFadden and Craig Gilroy it was an opportunity to showcase their talents and put their hand up for selection as first choice wingers Keith Earls and Tommy Bowe were ruled out of the opening game against Scotland through injury with Earls unlikely to feature in any of this season's championship. 

### **RECIPES OPERATION TRANSFORMATION**

### CHICKEN AND CHORIZO BAKE

#### The Ingredients

- · 350g chicken breast, chopped into 1 inch pieces
- · 200g whole wheat penne pasta
- 1 courgette, chopped
- · 1 green pepper, deseeded & chopped
- · 1 sweet pointer pepper, deseeded & chopped
- 90g sundried tomatoes drained
- 2 cans chopped tomatoes
- $(400g \times 2)$ 2 tablespoons of sundried
- tomato pesto 100g chorizo ring, chopped
- · Bunch of basil chopped or 3 teaspoons of dried basil

Serves 4 adults.

#### The Method

Preheat oven to 200 Celcius/ Gas Mark 6.

Place penne pasta in a large pot of boiling water.

Cover and simmer for 10 -12 minutes until it is slightly underdone. Drain pasta.

Chop up the fresh basil.

To an ovenproof casserole dish, add chicken, vegetables, sun dried tomatoes, pesto, chopped tomato, basil and chorizo.

Mix well, gently stir in pasta.

Cover with aluminium foil and place in oven and cook for 45 - 60 minutes until chicken is cooked through.

Remove foil and cook for a further 10 minutes for a crispy top. Serve.

### TUNA PASTA BAKE

#### The Ingredients

- · 100g raw whole wheat penne pasta
- 25g butter,
- 25g flour,
- 200mls low fat milk,
- 2 tablespoons of tomato puree
- 130g tinned tuna
- 100g sweet corn,
- 1 red peppers, deseeded & chopped
- · Salt and pepper to season

# WORKPLACE BULLYING

Workplace bullying can be guite common and difficult to deal with. Bullying at work can take the form of physical, social or psychological intimidation. Examples include threatening behaviour, sexual harassment, verbal abuse, exclusion, psychological harassment, being given pointless or impossible tasks, deliberately making work difficult for you and withholding information necessary to get your work done properly. This type of bullying can be difficult to identify as it isn't always obvious, but it can have a serious effect on one over time. Workplace bullying can lead to a drop in productivity, lowered confidence and self-esteem, increased anxiety, stress and depression. It can also lead to physical symptoms such as tiredness, headaches and backache.

Workplace bullying can have a serious impact on family life and put stress on relationships. The target of the bullying may feel unable to share what is happening at work because they should feel grateful to have a job and may not want to worry a partner or spouse. It may put extraordinary pressure on the victim to the extent that they can take it out on others, even to the extent of engaging in abusive or aggressive behaviour at home. If you are experiencing workplace bullying it is vital that you seek some much needed support. This support may be from a Human Resource Manager, a supervisor or your employer. If the situation continues or is serious, you may need to make a written complaint. It can be very helpful to keep a diary documenting everything that happens, including what you've done to try stopping it. Make sure you are informed – find out what the organisation's policies and procedures are for preventing and handling bullying. All employers have a duty to ensure the health and safety of their employees. Section 8 of the Safety, Health and Welfare at Work Act 2005 states that the employer is required to "prevent any improper conduct or behaviour likely to put the safety, health and welfare of employees at risk". As employees, we are duty bound not to engage in behaviour that would endanger the health, safety and welfare of ourselves and others. It is also wise to get external information and advice from bodies such as

the union representing your industry, the Health and Safety Authority or the Equality Tribunal. These organisations work to ensure that workplace bullying in not tolerated and can give you advice on your options and your

### **HYPERTENSION (HIGH BLOOD** PRESSURE) IS THE MAIN CAUSE OF STROKE AND HEART DISEASE.

#### WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS OF HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE?

There are few, if any, symptoms associated with high blood pressure, and the only way you can find out if you have high blood pressure is by having it

#### **HOW CAN BLOOD PRESSURE BE MEASURED?**

Your blood pressure measurement is a combination of two readings: systolic & diastolic blood pressure. Systolic blood pressure is the pressure when the heart contracts. Diastolic blood pressure is the lowest pressure when the heart is relaxing.

These will include your doctor asking you to use an ambulatory blood pressure monitor (ABPM) for 24hrs or ask you to take a series of blood pressure measurements at home (HBPM) before confirming a diagnosis of high blood pressure.

#### WHY SHOULD I BOTHER TO HAVE MY BLOOD PRESSURE MEASURED?

High blood pressure causes silent damage to the blood vessels and the heart. If untreated, this damage progresses over time and may result in stroke or heart attack

#### **CAN STROKE AND HEART ATTACK BE PREVENTED?**

The answer is YES! The reason doctors want to detect people with high blood pressure is that it is now well established that if high blood pressure is brought down to normal levels, the damage to the cardiovascular system is halted and may even be reversed, and therefore stroke and heart attack can be prevented, or at least postponed.

High Blood Pressure can be controlled by medications but it is also important that individuals with high blood pressure take appropriate lifestyle measures such as:

- 1) Healthy Eating, especially low salt intake.
- 2) Weight Control.
- 3) Regular Moderate Exercise.

It is also advised that a person diagnosed with high blood pressure should regularly carry out Home Blood Pressure (HBPM) Monitoring using clinically validated Blood Pressure Monitor and bring the



# **AVOIDING CAR PARK FENDER BENDERS**

### CHECKLIST FOR SAFE PARKING IN CAR

Whether it's a crunch, wallop, groan or bang the sound of your car crashing into another vehicle or object is a total misery for any driver.

Unfortunately, as many drivers discover, fender benders happen in car parks on a very regular basis. A recent poll reveals that 25% of drivers in this country have damaged their vehicles while parking over the last three years.

During the poll, of those involved in a car parking incident, 85% of drivers said they damaged their own vehicle, 18% admitted damaging someone else's car, 4% said they drove over their own belongings or those of a family member, 4% admitted to driving over a pet/animal and 2% said they damaged public property. Of the motorists who admitted to damaging 3rd party property while parking their car, 44% waited to talk to the vehicle's owner/ property representative, 35% left a note on the car's windscreen with their car insurance details, 12% left without telling anyone and 4% informed the Gardaí.

If you do damage to someone else's vehicle and leave the scene, even if it's in a car park, in the eyes of the law it's still classified as a hit and run. If an accident does occur take responsibility for your actions and speak to the vehicle/property's owner. Avoiding car park crashes!

To avoid car park fender benders and the hassle of a car insurance claim, we've put together the following motoring advice:

- :: Slow down. It's a car park not a race track!
- :: Look out for distracted pedestrians. They will be pushing heavy trolleys, lugging bags of shopping, supervising children, chatting on their mobile phones etc.
- :: Be patient. Impatience will only lead to careless driving.
- :: Turn off your car radio when in car parks. It'll distract you and vou won't hear other vehicles.
- :: Give reversing the car your full attention. Don't be checking your texts, tuning the radio or programming your car's Sat-Nav when pulling out of your car parking space. Check and check again that you're clear to reverse your vehicle. And don't forget to check if there's someone about to pull out of the car parking bay directly behind you or else you could have a case of bumper cars on your hands.
- :: Park your car in the centre of the parking bay. This will make it easier to reverse your car out when leaving and also will reduce



the likelihood of the cars either side of you doing damage to your

- :: Don't squeeze into a parking space which barely allows you to open your car doors just for the sake of being closer the shops. You'll only end up scratching your car of those either side of you.
- :: Use your indicators. Although not on a main road, you still need to let other drivers know which way you're turning your
- :: Ask your children to be quiet when parking the car.

Motorists should not block footpaths, they should be conscious of people with prams and buggies or wheelchairs, and respect disabled only car parking spaces.














### THE PLIGHT OF THE ROMA **EUROPE'S UNWANTED PEOPLE**

Approx. 10 to 12 million Roma people live in Europe. They have lived here for over 1,000 years -- and have been ostracised, persecuted and suppressed as gypsies for centuries. The Nazis murdered hundreds of thousands of them. The Roma are Europe's biggest minority -- and remain the Continent's unwanted people.

Almost 70 years after the end of the Nazi era, German Chancellor Angela Merkel of the Christian Democratic Union party in 2012 unveiled a monument to the Roma and Sinti murdered in the Holocaust. But the debate now fanned by the Christian Social Union, the Bavarian sister party to Merkel's CDU, about so-called "poverty migrants" from Bulgaria and Romania, which is also raging in other EU countries, shows that old prejudices persist across Europe. The dark-skinned Roma sings and steals, doesn't put shoes on his children's feet and likes living in the dirt -- that's their tradition, so the prejudice goes.

In the West too, virtually all of them remain bitterly poor and discriminated against - is it any wonder that some of them resort to crime

A visit to Antena, a settlement on the outskirts of the Serbian capital Belgrade, shows the extent of improvements needed in Bulgaria, Romania and Serbia. There's no running water, the toilets are holes in the ground. The air smells of urine, mold and burned plastic.

Ramiz, 28, lives here along with 600 other Roma. He purchased eight square meters of a garbage dump for his hut for €40. Ramiz says the Roma are "the invisible people of Belgrade." Half the inhabitants of Antena have no passport or birth certificate. For the Serbian government, they simply don't exist, and they get no welfare benefits.

Most of them, like Ramiz, came during the Kosovo conflict at the end of the 1990s. During the day Ramiz and his children gather up cardboard or sift the garbage for packet soup past its sell by date, opened cornflakes boxes or cocoa powder. He has the business card of a man in his pocket who smuggles people without papers across the border to the north. Transport costs €100, bribes for the border guards cost €400. Ramiz hopes he can round up so many clients that the trafficker will let him go along free of charge.

Antena is just one such settlement in Belgrade. There are hundreds like it in Serbia and thousands in the other countries of Eastern Europe. In 2011 the European Commission together with the UN Development Program and the European Agency for Fundamental Rights examined living conditions of more than 80,000 Roma people living in 11 EU member-states and found that one-third of them were unemployed and 90% lived below the poverty line.

But the Roma aren't just trying to flee poverty. They are also trying to get away from discrimination and abuse. In Romania, a far-right group last January called for the sterilization of Roma women. Bulgaria last year saw anti-Roma demonstrations in the capital, Sofia. In 2012, a mob in the Czech Republic chanted "gas the gypsies" after a 15-year-old claimed he had been beaten up by Roma people.

Human rights campaigners say the situation for Roma is particularly precarious in Hungary - even though the government claims to have a strategy for integrating them. "The Roma in Hungary are systematically discriminated against," says Gabor Daróczi, director of the Romaversitas foundation which funds education projects for Roma. "They can't find work, children don't get an education." He said the sentiment against Roma in Hungary reminded him of the 1930s.

In August, three men were convicted of murdering six Roma out



of racial hatred.

Members of the right-wing government of Prime Minister Viktor Orbán openly agitate against Roma people. Zsolt Bayer, cofounder the ruling Fidesz party said: "Most gypsies aren't suited to communal living. If they encounter resistance, they commit murder. These gypsies are animals and they behave like animals. They shouldn't exist, the animals. One has to solve that -- using all means available!"

In March 2011, far-right militants occupied Gyöngyöspata, 80 kilometers northeast of Budapest, for several weeks. Neo-Nazis marched through the streets threatening and beating up Roma people. The government didn't intervene against the racists. When an aid organization took hundreds of children from the village, the government described the rescue as an "Easter vacation."

In the end, the police did get involved and the militants left. But life hasn't improved for the Roma in Gyöngyöspata. They live in a settlement in the valley. Their homes are made of corrugated iron and chipboard, and in winter the paths are churned into

### **GOOD NEWS - ANOTHER KENNEDY SPEAKS OUT** AGAINST INJUSTICE:

If dolphins could tweet, many would surely be writing some version of "Thanks @CarolineKennedy for trying to save our

On January 17th, Caroline Kennedy the daughter of the late US President John F. Kennedy and his wife the late Jacqueline Lee Bouvier, just two months into her job as the U.S. ambassador to Japan, sent shockwaves around the world by tweeting against the slaughter of dolphins in the cove at Taiji, Japan. "Deeply concerned by inhumaneness of drive hunt dolphin killing," Ms. Kennedy tweeted. "USG (U.S. Government) opposes drive hunt fisheries."

The tweet, and the buzz it generated among diplomats, celebrities, activists, and media outlets, has thrust Taiji, a fishing town of 2,000 people, back into the international spotlight for the first time in nearly four years. In March 2010, The Cove won an Academy Award in the documentary feature category for first exposing the village's dolphin secret.

Roughly eight hours before her tweet, fishermen drove 250 dolphins from the open ocean into the village's narrow bay, which is bordered by high, rocky cliffs. They remained there, trapped in nets, for four nights, before fishermen slaughtered 40 of them. An additional 52 were selected for sale to aquariums, while the others were released. The cull represents the largest one-day kill at the cove since Nov. 23, 2013, when 54 striped dolphins were slaughtered.

Though welcomed by millions, the ambassador's missive sparked anger in some corners of Japan, a close U.S. ally. Chief Cabinet Secretary Yoshihide Suga said Monday the hunts are legal and appropriate and that eating the meat is a local custom. "Dolphin fishing is a form of traditional fishing in our country," Suga said. "We will explain Japan's position to the American side."

The pushback stretched from Tokyo to Taiji, where an unnamed fisheries official told Agence France Presse that Ms. Kennedy should visit the cove and learn about the new humane way of killing dolphins. "We have switched to a more humane way of butchering them," he said. "We cut the spinal cord so that they don't bleed. We don't butcher them like before."

"The new slaughter process is called pithing, where they hammer a metal rod into the spinal cord of the dolphin," Melissa Sehgal, senior campaign leader of Sea Shepherd's Cove Guardian campaign, said "These dolphins do not die immediately. It takes up to 20 to 30 minutes for these dolphins to die, where they bleed out, suffocate, or drown from the process of being dragged to the butcher house," she added.

Since 2000, the annual hunt, which runs from September through mid-April, has caused the deaths of roughly 18,000 dolphins. Most are butchered on-site for food (despite extreme mercury concentrations in dolphin meat), while the youngest, cutest ones are spared and sold for up to \$125,000 each to marine-mammal facilities in Russia, the Middle East, Latin America, the Caribbean, and East Asia.

A US State Department spokesperson issued a statement in support of Ambassador Kennedy's tweet. "The U.S. does remain committed to the global moratorium on commercial whaling, and we are concerned with both the sustainability and the humaneness of the Japanese dolphin hunts. We have been very clear that this is our position, and we remain concerned about it. And the ambassador was expressing our view that we've made public for a long time."

The British ambassador to Japan, Tim Hitchens, also tweeted, "Taiji Bay Dolphins: the UK opposes all forms of dolphin and porpoise drives; they cause terrible suffering. We regularly raise with Japan."

Noted personalities also jumped into the fray. In a letter addressed to the Taiji fishermen, Yoko Ono wrote that world anger was jeopardising her birth country's standing. Virgin Group's Richard Branson, who has not publicly condemned marine-mammal captivity, wrote on the company's website: "Those Japanese people who support the killings in Taiji should realise the damage the slaughter in the cove does to the reputation of their otherwise delightful country."

#### TIPS FOR AN **AWESOME NATURE JOURNAL:**

No matter your age, in today's digital world, a nature journal you fill with sketches and notes can be a fun way to reconnect with wildlife. So put down your phone and pick up a pencil!

- 1. Always bring your journal and a pencil. You never know when nature will happen, and you want to be ready to record your observations.
- 2. Record the details. You'll begin to notice patterns if you add the date, time and weather to your entry. Note how things change based on these variables.
- 3. Slow down. Take time to walk slow or sit in one spot to allow your senses to fully observe.
- 4. Open all of your senses. Record what you see, hear, feel and/ or smell.
- 5. Focus your observation. There is a lot to see in nature, and it can be overwhelming to attempt to record it all.
- 6. Don't let the elements stop you. Whether it's rain, snow, wind or midges, nature happens. Come up with creative ways to be comfortable while you observe.
- 7. Keep curiosity alive. Allow your journal to be the beginning of an investigation, not the end. When you get home, do research about the things you observed.
- 8. Watch for signs of wildlife. Tracks and droppings are great to record. Additional things you may observe are rabbits, deer,

fox's, nests for birds or insect or spider webs.

9. Explore local nature sites. You don't have to travel into the wilderness to record nature, it's right in your backyard or neighbourhood park.

Remember that anyone can make a nature journal, and each one is completely unique. There are no rules. Grab a pencil and go connect with nature!
