There are phenomenal supports available for new enterprises through both South Kerry Development Partnership CLG (SKDP) and the Department of Employment Affairs and Social Protection (DEASP) to give them every chance to succeed. That was the message from The Busy Botanist co-founder Clair Kelly who was speaking to new start-ups at a networking evening in Killarney recently. This business has enjoyed considerable success since its foundation some two years ago in supplying organic naturally caffeine-free herbal teas to both Irish and overseas customers.

Speaking at the event organised by SKDP and which was attended by some 40 startup businesses, Clair said that her key advice for all of them was to attend all of the events suggested by the advisers or do something they suggest as what really helps a business to grow and flourish is gaining experience and networking.

Michael Kenneally of the DEASP pointed out to those present that in addition to their weekly payment, start-up businesses could also get financial support with the costs of setting up the business through the Enterprise Support Grant scheme. Elements that are covered this scheme include capital outlays, insurance costs and accountancy costs however a person has to be approved for the Back to Work Enterprise Allowance scheme.

Enterprise Officer with SKDP Joanne Griffin added that in addition to the enterprise support grant, SKDP can also provide additional capital support for start-up businesses through a once off grant scheme offering up to 65% funding to a maximum of €500. Aisling O'Sullivan Darcy of the LEADER programme also outlined to those present the range of supports potentially available through the enterprise stream of LEADER funding.

## DE GAULE. A Quiet Holiday



April 1969. n President De Gaulle announced his intention of retiring from the French presidency having lost a constitutional referendum. Wishing to

escape the media and political uproar created by his decision, as well as by the electoral campaign for his successor, on May 10th, president de Gaulle, his wife and his aide camp, Admiral Francois Flohic, were flown on a ministerial plane by the French Air Force to Ireland.

If De Gaulle chose Ireland, it is, according to Pierre Bitard, former diplomatic advisor to the French Embassy, 'because he could not, from his point of view, go anywhere but to a neutral country'. Furthermore, President De Gaulle's mother was the descendent of Irish ancestors, the McCartans, Jacobite emigrants to France after the Glorious Revolution, the overthrow of James 11 of England and Ireland in 1968.

We hope that his stay will be pleasant and that everything will go accordingly to his wishes, especially regarding his desire for anonymity". They called their collection "A guiet holiday".

## The hard work is done - Now it's time to reap the rewards in the State Exams

The State Exams begin on Wednesday for about 120,000 candidates, so this is the final weekend for major revision. Stick to your study plan on Saturday and Sunday. Concentrate on subjects being examined during the first week. As the exams run into the second and subsequent weeks, the optional subjects are nicely spaced out allowing for study days.

Leaving Cert candidates, prioritise last minute work in English, Home Economics, Engineering, Geography and Mathematics Paper One and get it done by Sunday night. Likewise, Junior Cert candidates, do the same in English, CSPE, Irish, Geography, Environmental & Social Studies and Maths Paper One. On Monday, concentrate on the tips for subjects being examined the first week. Don't cram on the days before the exam as this may cause confusion and fatigue. Spend an hour or two on Tuesday skimming over your notes for Wednesday's exams and leave it at that. Some relaxed leisure will be more beneficial than spending the day cramming material that you may not recall anyway. You'll need a clear and alert mind for the exams.

On the evening before each paper, spend an hour or so browsing your notes so that the important concepts are fresh in your mind. A heavy study session on the night prior to any paper is not a good idea as you will be exhausted the following morning. Instead, relax and get a good night's rest. Put all thoughts of the following day's exam out of your mind.

Over the next few days check your equipment and assemble your exam materials – biros, pencils, ruler, eraser, drawing instruments, calculator and so on. Have at least two biros in case one doesn't work properly. Organise your personal needs such as a watch and tissues.

A few nerves are normal on the first day so be prepared to deal with it. A relaxation exercise or maybe a shower to freshen up will do the trick. Eat a nutritious breakfast as you'll need the extra energy. Finally, go through your equipment checklist before leaving home.

On Wednesday, arrive at the exam centre at least a half hour before the exam begins. For all subsequent exams be present about fifteen minutes before the starting time. Spend the few minutes before entering the exam centre on your own in peace and quiet. At all costs, avoid groups doing last minute revision. If you need to, use the bathroom before you enter the exam centre. Be in your seat a few moments before the exam is due to begin. Synchronise your watch with the clock on the wall and use your watch or the clock to help you pace your work.

Check your seat and desk for firmness and stability. A shaky desk will torment you during the exam. When the answer book is distributed, fill in the required details and read the directions. Carefully read the instructions on the question paper in case there is any change of format. Don't be put off by your first glance at the paper. It's new and it will look unfamiliar at first. Once the exam begins, keep to your prepared answering plan.

Remain in the exam centre until the time is up. Recheck your work and extra information may come to you. Attempt an extra question only when you have thoroughly answered the previous questions. Once an exam is over, spend as little time as possible on a postmortem. Focus on the next paper and when the entire exam is over, forget about it. There is no advantage in dwelling on what might have been. Be satisfied that you have done your best. Good luck to all candidates starting exams next week.

In the next article, I'll explain how to make the most of the exam period.

✓Be in your seat a few minutes before the start of each exam

✓Check that your seat and desk are firm and steady

✓ Read the instructions carefully

✓Know what to expect but be prepared for the unexpected

✓Use all the time available to you

✓Once an exam is over avoid protracted postmortems

✓The Leaving Cert exam has two extra days this year

✓Exam timetables are available on www. examinations.ie

Murrihy & Seamus Shannon, John Hogan, Murial O'Connor & Fran Curry and a name to watch - 18 year old Keelan from Donegal. Special guest was Max T. Barnes from Nashville and the list goes on.

#### This week we focus on Gerry Guthrie

Ninger and guitarist Gerry Guthrie was born and raised in Ballina Co. Mayo, where he still resides. He showed a keen aptitude for music from a young age and having obtained

his first guitar when he was

eight years old with the help of Joe Sweeney his music teacher he mastered the instrument. Aged 15, Gerry began playing with a local group called The New Blues on the local pub and cabaret circuit. He subsequently moved on to work with The Richmond's, a wellestablished group playing lounge bars, weddings, dinner dances and private functions in the Mayo and South Sligo area.

In 2000, Gerry accepted an invitation to become lead guitarist with Sandy Kelly's band, with whom he stayed for three years. Whilst touring with Sandy he also worked on her hit shows "The Patsy Cline Story" and "A Night At The Opry". This gave him the opportunity to perform in theatres in Ireland, England and Scotland, in addition to television appearances. It was during this time that Gerry had the opportunity to work with Grand Old Opry Member and country music icon George Hamilton IV, The International Ambassador of Country Music.

Over the course of the following decade, Gerry worked as lead guitarist with Martin Cuff, Shawn Cuddy and Louise Morrissey. In recent years, Gerry has launched his one-man show, playing throughout Mayo, Sligo, Roscommon and Galway.

Gerry's musical influences include Duane Eddy, Hank Marvin, Merle Haggard, George Jones, Garth Brooks, Gene Watson and on the Irish scene Jimmy Buckley, Ray Lynam & Matt Leavy. He has long admired the impressive guitar skills of Declan Nerney.

In 2009 Gerry decided it was time to venture into the studio, shortly afterwards he released his first single, the Cal Smith song "Sunday Morning Christian", the track received a huge amount of airplay on local radio stations throughout the country.

It had long been Gerry's dream to front his own country band, and a chance meeting with Henry Mc Mahon at a Jimmy Buckley dance brought Gerry one step closer to fulfilling it. Henry takes up the story "I had heard his single "Sunday Morning Christian", and when I met him, I was amazed how much we had in common when it came to singers and songs. I am always of the opinion that a good dance programme is the most important ingredient in our type of music". In the following months, Gerry was signed to Henry McMahon Promotions & the K-Mac record label.

The first thing was to find a suitable song to launch Gerry's career. Karen from K-Mac Records came across the song "Shut Up Heart", and was just waiting on the right singer to record it, that singer was Gerry and he was knocked out by the song. Straight away he contacted Jonathon Owens at Spout Recording Studio, went in and recorded the song. The release of "Shut Up Heart" brought Gerry's distinctive country voice to a whole new national audience. Gerry has definitely served his apprenticeship. He is now one of the top attractions in the country. His new single 'Tequila Sheila' is being played on every radio station in the country.

#### Killarney went to the polls on Friday last to elect 7 councillors for the Killarney Municipal District, 5 MEP's and to decide on a change on the Referendum for Divorce.

On the home front sitting Councillor John Sheahan, lost his seat on the 7th count to Marie Moloney who polled 1,400 to 1,258. The Killarney Electoral Area had an electorate of 20,864 with the total poll being 12, 794 and the quote set at 1,584.

Independent candidate Maura Healy-Rae topped the poll on the first count with 3,099 and was elected at this stage, as was Michael Gleeson with a total poll of 1,983.

The two councillors were quickly followed on count two by Brendan Cronin whose total votes came to 1,727 and Niall Kelleher with 1,603.

Count three in Killarney saw Donal Grady being elected on 1,618 followed by new candidate Niall "Botty" O'Callaghan on count 6.

The final seat was allocated to Labour candidate and former Senator Marie Moloney who beat John Sheahan the sitting Cathaoirleach of the Killarney Municipal Area.

There are now five independent councillors representing the Killarney Municipal Area on Kerry County Council and these are Brendan Cronin, Maura Healy-Rae, Donal Grady, Michael Gleeson and Niall 'Botty' O'Callaghan along with Niall Kelleher, Fianna Fail and Marie Moloney, Labour.

#### TAX RELIEF FOR NEW START-UP COMPANIES

If you have started a new company, you may be able to apply for tax relief for start-up companies. This tax relief, also known as Section 486C tax relief, is a reduction of your Corporation Tax (CT) for the first three years you trade.

The relief can be applied to the profits from your new trade and on chargeable gains made on assets used in that trade.

You may be entitled to relief if your CT due is  $\leq$ 40,000 or less in a tax year. If your CT due is between  $\leq$ 40,000 and  $\leq$ 60,000, you may be entitled to partial relief.

Tax relief for start-up companies also depends on the amount of employer's Pay Related Social Insurance (PRSI) you pay. This must be a maximum of  $\in$ 5,000 per employee and  $\in$ 40,000 overall.

Since 2013 it may be possible for your company to carry forward any unused relief from your first three years trading.

#### DRIVING AND VISION



Make sure you have regular sight tests and if your optometrist tells you that you must not drive, you must stop all driving immediately. Driving when you are medically unfit to do so is a criminal offence, and you may be prosecuted if you are involved in an accident. Driving glasses

If you have been advised to wear glasses for driving, make sure you wear them, even for short trips and keep a spare pair in the car. Choose glasses with thinner sides for driving as they won't block your side vision as much as thicker ones. If you wear contact lenses, keep a pair of glasses in the car in case you need to take your lenses out. Even if you don't need to wear glasses all the time, you will probably find they are particularly helpful when the lighting is poor, and for driving at night. Headlights of oncoming traffic can be dazzling when you are driving at night or in

poor weather conditions.

Special driving lenses designed with a specially-developed glare filter and a contrast-enhancing filter can help reduce reflections and uncomfortable glare from oncoming traffic.

If glare is an ongoing problem for you, make sure your windscreen and headlights are thoroughly cleaned and free from grime and dirt. If you wear glasses, and don't forget to keep them clean too. If you find that problems with glare at night persist, make an appointment to have a sight test. Sunshine can be dazzling too, particularly when the sun is low in the sky. If you wear glasses, you may find it helpful to have a pair of prescription sunglasses in the car, or to wear clip-on sunglasses over your prescription glasses. Polarised sunglasses are great for driving in bright conditions. Polarised lenses are lenses with a special built in filter to reduce glare and improve vision in bright conditions

Most herbs are very easy to grow. They can be grown in the garden in vegetable beds or raised beds or in container like a window box on a window sill. There are a lot of different types of herbs but the most commonly grown herbs for culinary use are the basil and dill which are annuals and have to be sown every year Parsley and Chervil which are biennials and last for two years while herbs lie fennel, mint, tarragon are perennials. If you want to grow mint make sure you plant it in a container and not in the ground as it is a very invasive herb.

Even if you are not using your herbs for culinary use, it is important to pick them regularly — otherwise they tend to go to seed very quickly.

## Know Your Rights:

#### QUESTION

How do I access the Early Childhood Care and Education Scheme for my 2 year-old child??

#### ANSWER

The Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) Scheme provides free early childhood care and education for children of pre-school age. It gives children their first formal experience of early learning before starting primary school.

Your child can start ECCE when they are 2 years and 8 months of age and continue until they transfer to primary school (once they are not older than 5 years and 6 months at the end of the pre-school year). The Department of Children and Youth Affairs' eligibility calendar shows when your child can participate in the ECCE Scheme.

If your child has special needs they may be able to get an exemption from the upper age limit. If you have a child with a disability, you can also apply for additional supports under the Access and Inclusion Model (AIM) - you can find more information on aim.gov.ie.

Children can only enrol in pre-school in September. The ECCE Scheme runs from September to June for 3 hours a day, 5 days a week. If your child attends a childcare service (crèche, playschool, naíonra, Montessori or parent and toddler group) for longer than this each day or for extra weeks outside the school year (38 weeks) you have to pay for these extra hours.

To get a place for your child, apply to a participating playschool or day care centre. You can get a list of participating services from your local City or County Childcare Committee (CCC) on myccc.ie. You will need to provide a copy of your child's birth certificate or passport and their PPS number.

### NASA IS GIVING OUT FREQUENT FLYER POINTS TO MARS

You might not have done an intensive astronaut training course, but NASA still wants you to get involved in its next mission to Mars. The space agency is giving regular people like you and me a chance to send their name -- etched onto a microchip -- on the Mars 2020 mission. Not only that, but if you get your name etched into the spacecraft that flies to Mars, you'll also rack up "frequent flyer" points and a souvenir boarding pass to show off to your Earth mates.

It's part of a campaign to build buzz around NASA's Mars 2020 mission, which is sending a rover to the Red Planet to search for signs of past microbial life, collect samples and study Mars' climate and geology. NASA is also billing the mission as "the initial leg of humanity's first round trip to another planet" so being part of the expedition brings significant bragging rights. The JPL team is busy working on the Mars 2020 rover, aiming to launch it in July 2020 ahead of a February 2021 touchdown on Mars. Meanwhile, you can sign up through NASA's website to get your name on the list until Sept. 30, 2019.

## DUNDEE HAS CREATED ITS OWN FRAGRANCE

A unique "bespoke scent" was developed for the city in a 1970s shopping arcade which was taken over for the Dundee Design Festival, 100 samples of a limited edition scent representing a "collective vision" of the future of Dundee in 2039 was distributed at the new-look Keiller Centre, which hosted the event that ended on May 28th. The city's new scent which was "diffused" at regular intervals from a specially-created laboratory was created by a Glasgow-based fragrance designer Clara Weale and Dundeebased designer Pete Thomas,

The festival, which was staged for the third time, included a "city brand simulator," an interactive installation allowed visitors to shape their own future image to represent the city and a Poster Playground which encouraged visitors to create their own designs using materials inspired by the packaging of sweets sold by the Dundee confectionery firm James Keiller and Son, whose factory once occupied the site of the current shopping arcade.

2009 - Death of Cork born female impersonator Danny La Rue (Daniel Patrick Carroll) in London.

## AMAZON IS TURNING WORK TASKS INTO GAMES

Amazon has started installing screens next to workers' stations that feature simple games with names like PicksInSpace, Mission Racer, and CastleCrafter. Their physical actions, assembling orders and moving items, are translated into virtual in-game moves. So, the faster someone picks items and places them in a box, for example, the faster their car will move around a virtual track. The games are intended to make work less tedious, but also encourage higher productivity by pitting workers against one another in the virtual game world.

The games are voluntary and have so far been installed in five warehouses in the US and GB, and in at least one facility, managers reward workers who achieve high scores with Amazon "swag bucks." This is a company currency that workers can only exchange for Amazon-branded merchandise, like t-shirts and water bottles.

This transformation of work into would-be play is known as "gamification," and is a tactic often exploited by companies to increase engagement in products or services. Experts say these sorts of arbitrary targets and rewards have psychologically powerful effects. They can make rote tasks seem meaningful and engaging, and can be used to shape behaviour, pushing workers harder and harder. Amazon currently employees hundreds of thousands of workers in warehouses around the world, including more than 250,000 individuals in the US. The company recently raised its minimum wage to \$15 an hour, but stories of bad working conditions are rife. One survey from worker rights platform Organise found that 74% percent of warehouse workers avoiding going to the toilet for fear of missing productivity goals.

Meanwhile, Amazon continues to introduce greater numbers of robots and machines to automate elements of the job, already warehouse workers often now simply stand in one place while robots bring shelves of items to them from which they assemble orders, though the company says the possibility of fully automating its warehouses is at least a decade away due to technology constraints.

### THIS DOG THAT SHOPLIFTED A BOOK ON 'ABANDONMENT'

Last year, a stray dog was caught on camera sneaking into the Feevale University bookshop in Novo Hamburgo, Brazil. After managing to get past the front desk, the pup can be seen grabbing a book in its mouth and trotting out of the store. But it wasn't just any book – it was a book entitled "The Days of Abandonment"; a pretty relatable topic for stray animals.

Before the dog had a chance to read the pages, however, one of the campus students retrieved the book and gave it to the astonished cashier who was working the front desk. The bookshop staff was so tickled by the sneaky dog, they posted a video of the heist to Facebook where it later went viral and was seen by a group of local animal rescuers who stopped by the bookshop, and checked the dog into their care. The dog was given a bath, vaccinations, and a foster home following its rescue.
