In The Brehon on the Muckross Road, performer and vocalist Grace Foley will take to the floor for an intimate performance followed by a Site-Specific Theatre piece that will use four bedrooms in the hotel. Eleanor McEvoy is in concert at Muckross School House and a Voices for Women Writing Workshop at The Plaza Hotel kicks off at 6.00pm and is followed by Kampala to Killarney, an Afro Trad Ireland musical journey in St. Mary's Church of Ireland.

#### No footbridge between bus and rail stations

Following years of requests for a footbridge linking Killanrey Bus station and Killarney Railway Station, Cllr. Michael Gleeson is disappointed with the news that he received this week.

"Over the years I have been trying to get a Bridge erected to link Killarney's Bus Station and Train Station. In February 2018 I again raised this matter by means of a Notice of Motion to Kerry County Council. I have just received a reply as follows from Bus Eireann", Cllr. Gleeson told the Killarney Outlook.

"We have consulted with Irish Rail since a Bridge over the rail tracks is predominantly an Irish Rail matter. While a direct link would be desirable, a footbridge is not the option for accommodating the elderly or mobility impaired. An alternative Ramp Bridge would require a considerable amount of space which is not available on the train station side. The cost of any type of Bridge would also be very significant and the current route from Bus Station to Train Station via the shopping centre


is considered quite short and not prohibitive". "I am very disappointed with the response from Bus Éireann as many people are inconvenienced by the present situation of having to walk with luggage between Stations. The reply also fails to acknowledge

the efforts being made to progress Killarney towards achieving its designated objective of becoming Ireland's first fully accessible town for all. The response from larnród Éireann was equally negative. I will, however, continue to pursue the matter", ClIr. Gleeson added.

# KERRY 1978 FOOTBALL TEAM HONOURED BY GPA

he team that began Kerry's four in a row journey is being honoured celebrated by the GPA at the **GPA Former Players Reunion** Lunch, which will take place on the eve of the All-Ireland football final.

As this is a GPA event honouring these athletes, all former players are welcome, by contacting the GPA via email, formerplayers@gaelicplayers. com

Proceeds from this event will go toward the GPA Former Players Benevolent Fund.

This Kerry team capped off the year with a monumental win over Dublin in the final, with 17 points to spare (Kerry 5-11, Dublin

0-09), while also stopping Dublin's in a row aspirations. Under the stewardship of Mick O'Dwyer, this is the Kerry team that hosted a dynamic full-forward line up of Mike Sheehy, Eoin Liston and John Egan, with the late Páidí Ó Sé, Jack O'Shea and Pat Spillane also featuring. On their drive to the final, Kerry beat Waterford, Cork and Roscommon before coming up against Dublin. During the final, Mike Sheehy ensured his spot in football lore

when he scored his now infamous lobbed goal, while the Dublin goalkeeper was arguing with the referee. 1978 was the third of four All-Ireland football titles won by the Kingdom in the 1970s. The GPA Former Players Reunion lunch will take place on 1st September 2018, on the eve of the All Ireland Football Final. Each year at the event, one former hurler and one former footballer are recognised. Both will be presented with Lifetime Achievement awards

for their outstanding contribution to both codes. This year's

hurling award recipient is Galway's Joe Connolly and our football award recipient is Down's Paddy Doherty.

At the 2018 event we will also recognise the achievements of 10 teamshurling and football All Ireland winners through the decades from 1968-2008. While we are honouring those 10 teams, we also invite all former inter county footballers and hurlers to be present and enjoy the event.

There will be approximately 500 former players with some special quests in attendance

at the event. As well as honouring some of the greats of our games on their past achievements, our ambition is to grow this event, expand our Alumni of former players and enhance the level of support we can provide to former players if & when needed. All profits from this event will go directly to the GPA Former Players Benevolent Fund.

# Letter to the EDITOR

#### Dear Editor,.

Further to the campaigns to commemorate, in an appropriate manner, those who have made outstanding contributions to the social, business and political life of Killarney over a sustained period of time, I would like to add to those families mentioned, the Hilliard family. Recently while researching various outlets for a book I have written called "The Wonderful Life Of a Councillor" I sighted a brochure published by Hilliard enterprises who were celebrating one hundred years of business in 1946.

Hilliard's was one of the most important companies in Killarney and Kerry founded in 1846, when the great famine was causing such devastation throughout the land. R. Hilliard and Sons Ltd was later to encompass Hilliard and Palmer boot factory and in 1868 the boot factory was built.

In 1880 Richard's sons Robert and John took control of this very well organised enterprise. John was the principal driving force behind the expansion and development over the following years until his death in 1931. Described in the excellent publication "John was a man who united exceptional industry with foresight and astuteness of mind, he inspired his colleagues with his own zeal and it



was by his efforts that the drapery section was further expanded in 1894." In 1940 the turnout of boots was six thousand pairs per week with two hundred and sixty employed.


The total employed in all enterprises in Killarney was just over three hundred and fifty. There was three enterprises in total, which though functioning independently were connected, R. Hilliard and Sons Ltd., Killarney and Tralee; Hilliard and Palmer, Ltd. Killarney and the Lake hotel. Hilliard's were one of the principal employers in Killarney, Kerry and the south west until Hans Liebherr arrived in 1958. Over a period of almost one hundred and

fifty years the various Hilliard enterprises employed thousands from the Killarney area through this time span. That due recognition was not afforded to the Hilliard's over the years is a mystery but together with those already mentioned, Hilliard's would be greatly deserving of such an honour.

I have today advanced to the Killarney Municipal authority a request to the effect that the family would be so honoured.

# Races ensure a massive €8m boost for Killarney

KILLARNEY Races are now worth nearly €8 million to the local economy and the company that organises the three yearly festivals insists that the estimate is on the conservative side.

Hotels, guesthouses, restaurants, bars, shops and transport service providers all report a boom during the races in May, July and August, in addition to fashion houses and hair and beauty professionals who enjoy a huge spin-off from the Queen of Fashion event in July and Ladies Day in August.

An extra day of racing was added in July – bringing the total number to 12 in the year – and a whopping €1.5 million in prizemoney was on offer for the 2018 season. "The hope is to increase this next year, along with adding new dates to our already busy calendar," said Killarney Race Company Chairman, Gerard Coughlan.

"We went out on a real high with a 15 per cent increase in attendance last Saturday, the closing day of the August Festival, bringing a very successful year on the track to a wonderful climax. "Despite the drought, the course was in pristine condition for all three festivals and we would like to compliment course supervisor, Padraig Bruton, and his team for their great work," Mr Coughlan stated.

Killarney is unique in Irish Racing in that it hosts two separate Ladies Day events. This year marked Dawn Milk's 25th consecutive year associated with Killarney Racecourse through Queen of Fashion sponsorship in July and a new sponsor joined this year for the August Ladies Day with Simply Suits of Killarney and Cork coming on board. Another big attraction this year was the arrival

at the track, by helicopter, of newly crowned Rose of Tralee, Kirstin Mate Maher, who was making the first public appearance of her 12-month reign.

In keeping with the company's customer care policy, a complimentary return shuttle bus service from the town centre to the track and back was very well received by racegoers and it assisted greatly with the overall traffic management plan in place in the town.

On the racing front, there were a number of notable performers with a potential superstar winning his maiden in Killarney in July. Anthony Van Duck won by eight lengths and he has followed up since with wins in a Group 3 and, most recently, a Group 2 at the Curragh. Anthony Van Dyck is also the current ante-post favourite for the 2019 Epsom Derby. Another impressive winner in Killarney in July was Wicklow Brave who went on to win in Galway before returning to the August festival to win again.

Peregrine Run won in Killarney in July 2017 and followed that a year and a month later to win the feature race last Saturday. Camlann, meanwhile, won in Killarney in July and followed up with a victory at the Galway festival while Espere won in Killarney in May and also tasted success in Galway.

Lizzies Champ finished second in Killarney in July and went on to win in Galway.

"Killarney has unearthed some notable performers in the past along with some household names such as Derby winner Wings of Eagles and we hope that many more superstars will perform at the track in years to come," said Sales and Marketing Manager

# **Kerry ETB Doorway** to Dynamic Careers and Higher Education



or many the last week has been a time of angst. What next? Should I go to college, 6 option even have advanced entry routes to not to mention did I get the points to secure a place or can my family afford the three to four year investment? Well here is some good news...there are many more options available to you and they are on your doorstep.

Even for students who got top points in the Leaving Certificate, Further Education is a fantastic way to experience a new vocational area while you become a self directed independent learner, but in a well supported environment. For some, a first year lecture theatre with 300 people who don't know your name is not a place they want to be.

PLC Colleges of Further Education have come a long way since the days of general secretarial studies for the girls and trades for the boys. Options now include: Physiotherapy Assistant; Computer Game Design and Development; Software Development; Engineering Technology; Fashion Design; Youthwork; Music Technology; Animal Care and Grooming to name just a few.

Today Kerry College of Further Education (KCFE) in Tralee, and North Kerry College of Further Education (NKC) in Listowel, run by Kerry ETB, offer alternative routes through CAO to Higher Education and pathways to dyyear two of certain higher education courses.

PLC courses are open to school leavers and mature students. Financial supports such as the SUSI grant or the Back to Education Allowance are available to eligible learners. The focus is on giving the learner the opportunity to get a great academic foundation in their chosen field, along with hands on learning through practical application, projects, group work and work experience. Assessment is mainly by continuous assessment.

"We like to prepare our learners really well for their work experience. I think that is why many of them end up in full time employment afterwards. For example on our Engineering Technology course, the class is exposed to a range of engineering processes such as welding, brazing etc, as well as Computer Aided Design (CAD) and Computer Numerically Controlled (CNC) Machining so they already have skills to bring with them and apply during work experience", said Stephen Goulding, Principal of North Kerry College of Further Education.

Karen Whelan, who did Pre Nursing Studies in Listowel said "I was absolutely delighted with the course. I learned so much and gained a huge amount of skills from my work experience in a nursing home. I am now totally sure that nursing is the career for me because of this course. The high standard of teaching and support I received allowed me to obtain very high exam results. Thanks to this pre-nursing course I have secured a place in the University of Southampton in the UK where I will obtain my Bachelor of Nursing degree. I can't wait to begin my career in Nursing."

This time last year 19-year-old Paul Sheerin was disappointed he didn't get a place on the Level 8 (honours degree) Bachelor of Music at Cork IT. So the Trumpet player from Rathmore did the KCFE Music Thecnology course instead. Now he says "doing the PLC was the best decision I ever made". And he is starting the CIT course he wanted next month.

Some PLC applicants who may not meet the entry criteria, or have not been involved in learning for a long time, may opt to do a VTOS course first. This is a well structured and supported two year course with academic, personal, financial and childcare supports built in. You have to be over 21 years and in receipt of a social welfare payment for six months. VTOS is available in four Kerry towns, including the option to do a Leaving Certificate in Tralee.

One past Killarney VTOS learner said, "I started VTOS in 2014 and was very nervous returning to education having completed my Leaving Cert in 1988. I couldn't recommend VTOS highly enough – from the open day right through to the last day of the 2 years. It was a purely positive experience from start to finish. The teachers are fantastic, all extremely fair and committed. The subjects are interesting and diverse- something for everyone. I learned so much in two years in particular about myself and for that I am entirely grateful and I made wonderful friends. All I learned in VTOS I'm using on a daily basis at work and I know there is no way I'd be still working at this job without VTOS and the fantastic start I got there. I am working in an office doing wages and accounts and not a day goes by that I don't think of VTOS especially the computer and payroll classes – everything I learned in these I use on a daily basis."

# College students face daily commute to avoid homelessness in accommodation crisis

A new survey from the Irish League of Credit unions has found that 69% of third level student are now living at home during term time. Many are forced to make a daily return commute from Kerry to Limerick or Cork because they can't afford the spiralling unregulated cost of student accommodation.

The research shows that the average monthly cost of accommodation has exceeded €1000 in Dublin, with costs increasing by 20% since last year. Nine in ten parents are funding their children's education but are getting into considerable debt to do so. Some parents say it's costing up to €15,000 per annum to put a child through college. Accommodation, student contribution, travel, books, laptop, food and utilities are factored into the cost.

The supply of rental accommodation is at a critically low level and students are competing for the most basic accommodation with those who cannot afford to purchase a home or are awaiting social housing. Students who normally live away from home during the academic year now face the prospect of missing out on college if they can't, firstly, find accommodation and secondly, if they don't have the means to pay for it. The alternative is a long daily commute to and from college which is costly in terms of time, fatigue and finance. In fact, application data reveals that the vast majority of college applicants from Kerry look no further than Tralee, Cork and Limerick as they now accept than Dublin is unaffordable

An increasing number of parents are cutting back on family clothing, household goods, food, groceries and a family holiday to cover the cost of third level education. Money issues are the biggest concern for all parents of college students with 42% saying it occupies their minds more than any other issue. Six in ten parents

are forced into debt to fund their children's third level education. The survey has also found that an increasing number of parents are borrowing from moneylenders.

The financial burden is somewhat eased for the four in ten students who qualify for partial or total state funding. However, many college students have to work part-time to make ends meet. Students who are ineligible for funding due to punitive means testing of the family income must come up with an average of €10,000 annually for accommodation and maintenance if they are living away from home or about €5000 if living at home. The unjustifiable student contribution of €3000 has also to be paid.

Currently the maximum standard maintenance grant payable to students whose college is 45 km (28ml) or more from their homes is only €3025 (non-adjacent grant). For students who live less than 45km from their college, the standard maximum grant is a paltry €1215 (adjacent grant). Means testing of applicants for grants is now so restrictive that thousands of students in third level education may be ineligible for any financial aid this academic year. Capping the gross annual income levels for grant eligibility at €39,875 has made a mockery of spiralling living costs and is financially crippling middle income families.

Student Universal Support Ireland (SUSI), the grant awarding authority will process late applications. Submit your online grant application as soon as possible. Applicants are assessed on gross income from all sources in the 2017 financial year. Further information on state funding can be found on www.studentfinance.ie. Most of the institutions also offer scholarships for excellence in areas such as academic, sport, creative arts and entrepreneurship. Colleges also operate a Financial Assistance Fund for students

experiencing financial difficulty during term. Go to the relevant colleges' websites for further details. Watch out also for local scholarships such as Credit Union Scholarships available to members. If at all possible avoid taking out a student loan, but if you must then the best rates are available from your local Credit Union.
















# **CROWS HIRED TO** EDUCATE PEOPLE

An unlikely new group of freelance employees have been added to a French workforce.

At the Puy du Fou theme park in western France, six birds have been employed to collect and dispose of litter - mainly cigarette ends and other small pieces.

As payment for their services, the birds take the collected rubbish to special bins where they can receive bird food in exchange for depositing the

Corvids like crows, ravens, magpies, and rooks have long been observed for their startling displays of intelligence. They are one of the smartest groups of animals on earth, with remarkable problem solving, tool making, and deductive reasoning skills.

# THE LAST PLASTIC STRAW

When is the last time you received a plastic straw without asking for it? Are you ready for it to be your last plastic straw?

Plastic straws are of no real value or significance to most people and they contribute massively to the plastic pollution problem in our oceans, waterways and beaches.

The Last Plastic Straw movement seeks to activate citizens through grassroots campaigning to encourage individuals to push for change in restaurant protocol and practices in their local communities. By becoming aware of the issue yourself and mobilising a movement within your community to limit and ultimately eliminate the use of plastic straws, you can bring about wider behaviour change and reduce the amount of single-use plastic damaging our planet.

The movement started in the US and teams of community organisers are now mobilising around the world to take simple, practical and effective action towards eliminating plastic straws.

1,800 Over restaurants, organisations, institutions, and schools worldwide have stopped using plastic straws or implemented a serve-straws-upon-request policy as part of the Last Plastic Straw movement. Businesses report a 60-90% reduction in plastic straw use and waste, resulting in significant financial savings.



# EVERYONE IN THIS VILLAGE 4 YEAR OLD READS BEDTIME CAN SPEAK SIGN LANGUAGE SO DEAF RESIDENTS CAN BE TREATED EQUALLY

Almost everyone in the little village of Bengkala in Bali can speak sign language so they can properly communicate, welcome, and respect their 40 deaf residents.

Ordinarily, a town of 3,000 people would have an average of 4 deaf residents, but the community experiences a high rate of deafness due to a recessive gene that has been passed down for the last seven generations.

Instead of ostracising their deaf neighbours, however, the town made up their own form of sign language called Kata Kolok.

# YOUNG KERY LAGS "KEANE" ON FIVE IN A ROW

t really is a sign of the great development work at underage level carried out by the county that sees the Kerry minor crop of 2018 compete in their fifth successive minor football final next Sunday when Galway stand in the way of a historic 5 in a row.

In fact, if stats could win games, then Kerry would have a strong hand. Unbeaten in 29 games since their victory over Clare in 2014 when Jack O'Connor's lads left Ennis with a 2-16 to 0-7 win back in 2014.

Four All Ireland victories to date with wins over Donegal (2014), Tipperary (2015), Galway (2016), Derry (2017) and now Galway look to avenge their 2016 loss and prevent something really special in the GAA world, a five in a row.

Still stats do not win games, players do and Kerry manager Peter Keane at every corner of this year's journey has played down the significance of any of what has gone before. "None of this team has played in those games and in fact they are now a lot younger with the age group gone to under 17", so in many ways Kerry despite their great showing this year are certainly breaking new ground.

Keane is a realistic when it comes to talk about records and five in rows. "There is no talk by any of the players or us as a management in viewing if that way (5 in a row), these players were only 11 or 12 years when all this (success) all began and all they want is their own medal which is something none of them hold at present"

In many ways, too they are a Kerry team who have shown a different glow to the teams

in the past as they have brought a new strength of character as witnessed in their wins over Cork and Monaghan especially. Games in which they were put to the pin of their collars to escape and games in which they never panicked and were calm under pressures. Something that belies their age. Keane, who is on his own personal three in a row, comes face to face with the team he conquered for his first All Ireland minor crown – Galway.

He is in no doubt that they present a major challenge. "They play good football like Galway teams traditionally have done and like the side we faced two years ago did as well. We don't see too many weak spots and obviously there is a desire for a double there with the Minor Hurlers having won their All Ireland."

#### **WALKING TO SCHOOL**

Research shows that children under 12 should not cross roads on heir own. They cannot decide how far away a car is or how fast it is going. They should be taken to school by a responsible adult.

Children should wear high visibility clothing when out walking.

If there is no footpath, you must walk as near as possible to the right-hand side of the road (facing oncoming traffic).

Choose a safe route to school and keep hold of your child's hand at all times.

Don't allow your child to cross the road between parked cars. This is very dangerous as a driver will not be able to see your child.

Show your child how to cross the road by example. Choose safe places to ross and explain

the reasons why to your child i.e. footbridges, zebra or pelican crossings, with a Garda, an adult warden or junior school wardens.

Ensure that your child always stops at the edge of the footpath, and always put

the Safe Cross Code (see overleaf) into practice. After some weeks assess your child's understanding by asking him/her to bring you across the road.

The best person to teach your child to cross the road safely is you. But remember, a child will do as you do, not as you say. So set the good example yourself!

#### **TRAVELLING BY BUS**

Teach your child to take special care when getting on or off public transport.

While waiting for a bus get them to stand well in on the footpath or grass verge.

Before crossing the road, they should wait until the bus has moved off and they can see clearly in both directions.

On the bus your child should remain seated until the journey is complete.

If safety belts are provided, they must be worn. Place school bags under the seat.

#### **DRIVING YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL**

Children should be secured in the back seat in a restraint appropriate to their weight and height. Children who are under 150cms in height and weighing less than 36 kilograms must use the correct child restraint when travelling in cars or goods vehicles. Ensure they cannot open doors

Children should never be left alone in a vehicle, even for a brief period.

Set down and collect your children on the school side of the road whenever

possible. Never park opposite and call your

You must not park where parking is prohibited by a traffic sign or roadway markings. Children are most vulnerable when crossing the road between parked

cars. Not only will the child be unable to see approaching cars, drivers will not see the child. Co-operate with school wardens. Drivers, please give cyclists plenty of room.

Set a good example to children by always wearing your safety belt.

#### **CYCLING TO SCHOOL**

Research shows that children under 12 do not have the skills and experience required to be safe in traffic on their own and should only cycle accompanied by an adult or responsible person.

Parents should decide whether their child is fit to cycle on public roads. When doing so they should be confident that their child possesses the appropriate skills and training. It is important that your child understands and is protected against potential hazards.

Children should be taught that a bicycle is a vehicle and must follow the same rules as other road users. Impress on your children that traffic lights apply to cyclists too and that Red means Stop.

Cyclists are advised to use cycle tracks where provided. By law, cycle tracks must be used as part of a pedestrian street/area or as part of a a contra flow cycle track. Where there is no cycle track, cycle on the left-hand side of the road.

Ensure the bicycle is a suitable size for your child and that he/she can comfortably apply the brakes.

Check that the bicycle's brakes, lights, reflectors, tyres and bell are in good working order.

Make sure your child is highly visible and wears a reflective belt and bright clothes. The higher the visibility, the lower the risk.

Because of their vulnerability cyclists should, in their own interest, wear protective headgear at all times. While it is not a legal requirement it is strongly recommended that cyclists wear a helmet suitable for their head size and ensure it is fitted correctly.

#### **OUESTION**

I am parenting alone and getting a One-Parent Family Payment. I would like to go back to college. What are my options?

#### **ANSWER**

Your options depend on your circumstances. You can go back to education and transfer onto the Back to Education Allowance to remain on your One-Parent Family Payment and apply for a

appropriate). You can also keep your Rent Supplement, medical card and other secondary benefits you may have. If you qualify for the BTEA, you are also entitled to an annual Cost of Education Allowance of €500 as you have a dependent child.

If you stay on your One-Parent Family Payment and are studying study part-time, you may be able to keep your Rent Supplement. However if you go back to full-time education and stay on your One-Parent Family Payment, you will no longer be eligible for Scheme or living in local authority housing, you continue to pay your differential rent. By the time you reach your final years in primary school, you will be totally comfortable with your school environment. By sixth class, you are one of the most senior people in your school and you are used to being given responsibility and looked up to by the younger children. However the transition to secondary school means that you have to revert to being the most junior again and have to cope with a brand new environment. Change can be a daunting task for any one of us and can take a lot of adjusting to

Easily the biggest change when entering secondary school is going from the experience of one teacher all day in one classroom to encountering eight or nine different teachers and subject/classroom changes every forty minutes or so. A tip to help you cope with this is to write down the name of each new teacher beside the name of the subject and write your own version of the class timetable. The second big change is the constant movement between classrooms throughout the day. Depending on your subject choices, you will be moving all around the school Getting lost during the first few weeks will be inevitable and a good tip is to always stay with at least one other person from the class. Another big adjustment is the number of specific subjects you will be covering. Students in First Year will cover up to sixteen different subjects; many of these will be new to you. Discuss all the subjects at home with your parents and let them know which ones you struggle with. Everyone will have their own favourites and will excel at certain subjects.

Your timetable will take a lot of getting used to and you may need help initially in the organisation of your schoolbag each day. Each student will also be provided with a locker and be sure to use your locker to avoid 'heavy bag syndrome'

Homework time is obviously going to increase. However not all subjects are covered every day and not all subjects involve homework. Learn how to successfully manage your time and don't rule out the possibility of supervised study. Schools reports may also be a new experience that comes with secondary school as regular reports come home from the school. Taking part in games and P.E. is a great way of getting to know. more students in your school. Find activities which you and enjoy and try out new activities even if you haven't tried something before, or if you don't know what the activity entails.

If you find yourself struggling with any aspect of this change be sure to talk to someone: Your parents, a friend, a class teacher or school counsellor. This time will fly by, and before long your new school will feel like your second home!!
